March 2013 President's Message

February was another busy month for us. Our February 28 panel on the federal health care act's implementation in Alameda was a big hit. Thanks to Tracy Jensen and Ruth Dixon-Mueller for putting together a fine panel and addressing a key issue for the League. We read a letter to City Council dealing with problems of process related to the Veterans Administration's proposal for Alameda Point. The Initiative and Referendum Study Group held its Consensus Meeting on February 23 to respond to the statewide study questions and our Board ratified the Consensus meeting recommendations at its meeting March 21. Membership has risen to 116, close to our all-time high, and we hosted a New Members Coffee and Orientation at High Street Station Cafe on March 23. And, as this column goes to press, plans are in place for our March 28 State of the Alameda Schools community forum at Cardinal Point from 7:00 – 9:00 pm.

In the background, the "Meet Your Public Officials" (MYPO) committee (Alice Wilson-Fried, Ruth Dixon-Mueller, and Jeff Cambra) has been meeting to do the advance work for our April 25 fundraiser. Invitations have been mailed, tickets printed and sent, raffle items are accumulating, food and drink is being organized, and volunteers are being lined up. Juelle Ann Boyer, the "keeper of the list," is printing badges for the public officials. MYPO is our biggest fundraiser each year, and we hope to have "all hands on deck" to make it a success. What does that mean? Take responsibility to purchase, sell, or donate the value of the five \$10 tickets you will receive in the mail. Come to the event. (Or come early at 4:30 pm to help set up on April 25.) Give your checkbook some exercise and participate in the live auction or the raffle. Donate items to the raffle or live auction. Bring your friends, neighbors, and relatives. Distribute some flyers to other groups to which you belong. (Email and posting on Facebook works, too.) Other than our yearly dues the League doesn't require a minimum amount of time or money from its members, but once a year, we can all step up and make MYPO a success. MYPO Is April 25: What LWVA Members Need to Know About Our Big Community Event and Fundraiser

April 25 brings our traditional Meet Your Public Officials (MYPO), where public officials are invited to gather and talk with their constituents. At MYPO, League members and residents have the opportunity to meet their public representatives and discuss issues that are important to the community.

MYPO is the largest annual fundraiser for the League of Women Voters of Alameda (LWVA) and is one of our biggest community events every year. This year MYPO will be Thursday, April 25, 2013, in the Alameda Elks Lodge Rathskeller (in the basement) at 2255 Santa Clara Avenue from 5:30-7:30 pm. The Elks Lodge is next to City Hall. Parking and an accessible elevator are at the rear of the building.

The LWVA's successful voter registration activities and voter education programs offer valuable opportunities for public entities to report to residents and connect with the community. But producing League events requires time and money—a single forum can cost over \$500.

In order to carry out the League's mission, we need MYPO raffle and auction items. Some ideas are: antiques and collectibles, autographed items and books, specialty and/or ethnic dinners in your home; gift certificates for air travel, restaurants, hair salons, coffee, or spa visits; handmade items, specialty baskets such as a pet lover's basket or a garden lover's basket, vacation getaways, time shares, services such as babysitting and home repair, or lessons such as art, music or cooking. Last year we raised \$1200 on the auction and \$670 on the raffle. More auction items means more support for our programs. Let's do better this year. *(Very few items have been donated as of press time. ed.)*

Each League member has been mailed five \$10 admission tickets to MYPO. *(We received ours several days ago. ed.)* You are encouraged to purchase all five and either sell or give them to family and friends. If you cannot attend, please send the League a check for \$50 or whatever you can afford to support our valuable work (MYPO, LWVA, PO Box 1645, Alameda, 94501). Last year MYPO raised \$1600 in ticket sales. Let's raise more in 2013. You can see our progress via weekly e-blasts.

Please encourage your family, friends, and neighbors to save the date and attend. Approach your favorite vendor(s) and solicit goodies to auction and raffle off. Don't fret pickup or delivery. Just contact Doris Gee (510-521-2117; dorisgee48@gmail.com), who will make sure that the auction and raffle items you donate or solicit get to MYPO.

Board Approves LWVA Initiative and Referendum Study Results from February 23 Consensus Meeting

At its March 21 meeting, the League of Women Voters of Alameda (LWVA) board approved the recommendations agreed to by those who attended the February 23 Initiative and Referendum Study Consensus meeting.

Twenty LWVA members met on Saturday, February 23, to discuss all of the Initiative and Referendum (I&R) Study questions from the League of Women Voters of California (LWVC, or State League). We reached consensus after much lively debate and discussion. Following board acceptance, LWVA group members entered our local I&R responses into the statewide data bank on March 22, completing the LWVA study process.

Similar Consensus results from Leagues throughout California will be compiled, analyzed, and presented at the statewide LWVC convention May 16-19 in San Jose. (*LWVA members need not be delegates to attend and are urged to participate in this near-by convention. See related convention story, p.3. ed.*)

Three changes stood out as we deliberated on I&R reform February 23:

- We all wanted much more disclosure and transparency.
- We all wanted to toughen the standards for passing constitutional amendments.
- We all wanted to add a pre-review by a non-partisan committee (including the Legislative Analyst) that could recommend changes to the proponents—but could not stop the process.

I want to again thank our hard-working committee members and congratulate the hardy group of 20 that spent the entire day going over these issues. As a first-time Study Chair, I was amazed at the process. We will submit a final I&R report—including the state convention results—this summer.

California League Launching ‘Next Generation’ Smart Voter: \$25,000 Challenge Grant Funding Campaign Open through June 30

Big changes are coming soon to the LWV of California’s Smart Voter® web site. Building on last fall’s successful beta test of Smart Voter’s new “Next Generation” web technology, the state League (LWVC) is poised to launch a brand new way of engaging and informing California voters online later this year. Detailed plans should be announced at the state League Convention in San Jose on May 16-19.

The new Smart Voter site will incorporate the latest interactive “Web 2.0” technologies and online journalism techniques to offer more information and resources to the 24 million Californians eligible to vote in 2014. In addition to the award-winning personal ballot lookup California voters have loved for over 15 years, visitors to the completely redesigned Smart Voter website will be able to view streaming videos, audio clips, interactive graphics, and selected news stories about election contests and campaigns, ballot measures, statewide issues, and voting.

“The new Smart Voter will have a ‘look and feel’ similar to interactive news sites like www.kqed.org, according to Ernie Ting, the Senior Director of Smart Voter.

The new Smart Voter platform will help Leagues at all levels to partner more extensively with other civic groups and news media outlets and easily share information, tools, and content on other organizations’ websites, mobile apps, and via social media to greatly expand our impact. The Next Generation open-source platform will place much more information at voters’ fingertips and be as easy to use on a smart phone or tablet device as it is on your desktop computer.

By adding more innovative technologies and expanding content, the LWVC’s Smart Voter leadership will offer local California Leagues the tools to be a vital resource for voters well into the 21st century.

“The project has cost upwards of \$40,000 so far and it is not finished yet. We are more than halfway done with building it and we plan to unveil the new Smart Voter site by the end of 2013,” added Smart Voter’s Ernie Ting.

Smart Voter recently received a \$25,000 challenge grant to support completion of this exciting new technological venture. Thanks to a group of longtime supporters, every new or increased donation to the Smart Voter that is received by June 30, 2013, will be matched up to the challenge amount. Draft ‘Plan Bay Area’ for Nine County Area Released March 22: Public Comment Period Closes May 16

The draft of Plan Bay Area, the 25-year comprehensive regional plan for integrated and sustainable housing, energy, land use, and transportation policies across the nine Bay Area counties, was released March 22. The draft is available for download here: <http://www.OneBayArea.org>.

The public has until May 16 to comment on the draft, either via e-mail (info@OneBayArea.org), the web (www.OneBayArea.org), US Mail (101-Eighth Street, Oakland, CA 94607), or at public meetings throughout the region: see the meeting details at: <http://onebayarea.org/regional-initiatives/plan-bay-area/meetings-events/Public-Workshops-Public-Hearings.html>.

Each public meeting includes an open house from 6:00 - 7:30 pm, followed by public hearings from 7:30 - 9:00 pm.

The plan’s accompanying draft environmental impact report (DEIR), released on March 29, has the same May 16 public comment deadline as the draft Plan Bay Area. Three additional hearings are scheduled to solicit public input specifically on the DEIR—in San Rafael (April 16), **Oakland (April 16)**, and San Jose (April 17).
